
Further details such as registration and payment information as well as Conditions of Contest will be published on the EBL website for the event.

After 10 rounds of play, team **France** (Donatella Halfon, Sylvie Willard, Danièle Avon, Babeth Hugon, Clara Bouton, Margaux Kurek-Beaulieu) won the tournament, defeating runner-up **Turkey** (Dilek Yavas, Serap Kuranoglu, Ozlem Kandolu, Eren Ozan, Irem Ozbay, Hatice Ozgur) by 7 VPs. **Norway** (Liv Marit Grude, Bodil Oigarden, Åse Langeland, Gunn Helness, Lisbeth Glærum, Ida Wennewold) secured the bronze and Irish team **Kenny** (Joan Kenny, Jeannie Fitzgerald, Rebecca O'Keefe, Gilda Pender) finished in 4th. " BBO gave a 5th Prize and it went to Irish team **Gannon** (Elva Gannon, Mary Trench, Miriam McConville, Valerie Hand).

RealBridge was the platform chosen by the players for the February series. Nine teams played, seven of which will play Venice Cup next month. As is the norm, the RealBridge team of Shireen Mohandes and Andy Bowles, gave this event the same time and support as if it were a major championship. TDs were Vigfús Pálsson and Ken Johnston both of whom were excellent.

This Round Robin played over two days with 96 boards had Norway in the lead after Day 1 followed closely by Turkey and Germany lay third. In the final result Turkey fell away to fourth, Germany with a strong performance overtook Norway to win the event, Norway was second, Ireland third.

For final preparation, the German Bridge Association is organizing a training weekend, which will give us an opportunity to fine-tune the system once again and to strengthen the team. For Gisela and Annaig, it will be the first time they sit together at the same table after 15 months of online bridge.

Our ambition for Salsomaggiore? First of all to have fun, enjoy the game with real cards and real players and meet again our international bridge friends. Right now, we are finding ourselves in an underdog position and profiting a lot from tailwinds and a good run. We are very much looking forward to Salsomaggiore!

Everyone is looking forward to the resumption of major face-to-face events as we get ever closer to the upcoming World Championships in Salsomaggiore in March. They will be followed by the return of the European Championships in Funchal in June before the show moves on to Wroclaw at the end of August and the second World Championship of the year.

In Italy England will be one of the favourites for the Venice Cup, their team including household names Nicola Smith, Sally Brock, Fiona Brown and Nevena Senior. However, following the completion of England's trials, the team for Funchal has a different look, as mesdames Smith, Brock and Brown all failed to qualify, Nevena Senior and Catherine Draper being the only 'survivors' from the team appearing in the World Championships.

Those two are joined by established stars Anne Rosen and Catherine Seale and newcomers, Ewa Wieczorek & Ewa Kater.

South's double on the second round led to the poor slam. As you can see, declarer needs a lucky position in spades to be able to dispose of the losing heart.

It reminded me of Napoleon's oft quoted, 'I know he's a good General, but is he lucky?'

North led the ♠K and declarer ducked, won the next spade, and played a heart to the jack. When it held, she cashed the ace and now had to turn her attention to the club suit. She came to hand with the king and then took the finesse. The good news was that it worked; the bad news that South pitched the ♦3. Declarer tried cashing the ♦A, but North's diamond was not the one she was hoping to see. She exited with a spade, but North won and cashed out for one down.

Have you spotted how declarer could have given herself a much better chance?

At trick three she can play the ♥Q. Assuming it holds she remains in hand and can now play a club to the jack. As the cards lie that will result in an easy overtrick. Having missed that, when returning to hand with the ♣K declarer must retain dummy's three! The fall of South's eight means that declarer can run the seven on the next round and then repeat the finesse which gets her up to nine tricks.

It will be exciting to see how this amalgam of old and new fares in Funchal – perhaps the answer lies in these lines penned by Bob Dylan:

*Come writers and critics who prophesize with your pen
 And keep your eyes wide, the chance won't come again
 And don't speak too soon, for the wheel's still in spin
 And there's no tellin' who that it's namin'
 For the loser now will be later to win
 For the times they are a-changing.*

THE VENICE CUP

Like the Bermuda Bowl, the **Venice Cup** was born out of a challenge match between the women's team from Italy representing Europe and a United States women's team and took the name from the City of Venice where the first edition was held in 1974 and which provided the prestigious trophy awarded to the winners of the World Championship for Women's Teams. The Italian Bridge Federation generously provides the replicas for the winners on each occasion. This

contest is of more recent origin than the Bermuda Bowl, but in other respects the development of the two competitions has been remarkably similar.

THE PLAYERS

In 2021, our team was faced with the challenge of having to play as a 4-person team in the EBL Qualifier for the 2022 Venice Cup. The team started well, and for a big part of the competition remained in contention for a qualifying place. In the final rounds, however, the effort of playing all the matches took its toll, and some lapses of concentration brought the team down to 13th place.

Since then, the team remains strongly engaged in the Portuguese high-competition programme, in preparation for the European National Teams Championships in June this year.

Anabela and Ana are two of the most experienced women players in Portugal. They have represented Portugal in several EBL Women's championships, since 1990. Having played together for several years in the past, they initially enrolled in the Portuguese high-level programme with different partners, but re-established their partnership in 2019.

GOOD NEWS CAME



Lone Bilde writes:

Our women's team has been practicing online since the first Covid cases were found in 2019. To date, one of our pairs has never played together in a live international tournament, although they do have thousands of online boards "in their legs". So, the longing to play international live bridge again is huge among all players.

As it turned out, the "weather gods" were not exactly on our side at the European online Qualifier tournament last summer. To put it mildly, it "rained" with accidents: One player had to go to work, so we played four-handed during the first days. Under normal circumstances this is fine, but already before the first match, one of the four remaining players fell ill and had to play anyway, something which was neither pleasant for her, nor optimal. On top of this, I managed to slip in an oil pool, fell on concrete and broke my elbow with a subsequent long night's stay at the hospital. We did what we could under those difficult circumstances, with a resulting 11th seat in the EBL qualifier. Need I say that we got severe bridge blues from that? More than two years of severe online practice and no qualification!

However, life is peculiar sometimes. Someone apparently heard our woes, as out of the blue, we received an invitation from the WBF to play at the Venice Cup 2022 anyway.

Participating in a world championship must be the highest goal of any sportsman and for a female bridge player, the Venice Cup is indeed the highest star to reach for. Therefore, we are thrilled that our Bridge Federation can find the funds to send us to Salso, that our workplaces will allow us to take leave on such a short notice, and that our patient kins will (again) take care of children, dogs, cats, hens, plants, houses and farms, while we are away.

All players have previous Venice Cup experience: Dorte Cilleborg Bilde, Trine Bilde and Charlotte Koch-Palmund won the bronze medal in Bermuda in 2000. Anita Buus Thomsen played in Shanghai (2007) with Helle Rasmussen who played two recent Venice Cups with me: 2019 (Wuhan) and Chennai (2015) where we lost the quarterfinal to the later gold medallists of France.

We are looking forward to a great bridge experience in Salso!

Samantha, well known international player, is Professor of Sociology at the University of Stirling, where she has been working to establish the Sociology of Bridge as a new research field. This has included 52 in-depth interviews with top players and a project (with English Bridge Education and Development) on wellbeing, healthy ageing and bridge. In 2019 Samantha launched the global Keep Bridge Alive (KBA) campaign and organised a successful BAMSA conference in June 2021.

Bridge: A MindSport For All
Connects People, Challenges Minds

Building a More Inclusive Community

Bridge: A MindSport for All (BAMSA) was invited to present a proposal at the EBL NBO Seminar regarding the development of an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) policy. Gender issues and inequalities within the bridge community are widely known and acknowledged but not by everyone. In particular, difference of opinion resides in what should be done to address gender inequalities and sexism.

Sexism within other sports is widely recognised and addressed, and bridge is lagging behind other competitive arenas in proactively engaging with and tackling everyday sexism and inappropriate remarks made at the bridge table (and within the wider bridge world). Other social inequalities also need to be addressed to ensure equality, inclusivity and fairness for all within the bridge community.

At the 'Bridging Academia, Policy and Practice' conference in June (hosted by BAMSA), the gender discussion panel argued that if meaningful change was to occur, it should be policy-driven. Cheating has been addressed by IBOs and NBOs (international and national bridge organisations) with new policies and procedures recently developed. The outcome of the BAMSA gender research and conference is that it is now time for sexism and other social inequalities to be taken seriously.

What should be done to enable bridge to be a more welcoming and safe environment for people of all social groups, regardless of gender, age, ethnicity, sexuality and disability? As well as the development of an Inclusivity Policy and awareness-raising, measures may also include the possibility of unconscious bias training for TDs, NPCs, coaches, selection committees etc.

As a result of the presentation, it is hoped that the EBL will develop a template for an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) policy that can be adapted by all NBOs. If you have expertise in this area and would like to help, please contact Sam at s.v.punch@stir.ac.uk
